<p><u>Community</u></p> <p>The school is 18 miles west of Chicago and serves a suburban residential area of approximately 25,000 people. Students live in sections of Westmont, Clarendon Hills, and Downers Grove.</p>	<p><u>Organization of School Year</u></p> <p>The school year consists of four quarters, each nine weeks long. The day is divided into seven 50-minute periods. The first semester ends on January 13, 2017, and the second semester ends on June 6, 2017.</p>
<p><u>School</u></p> <p>The Fall 2016 enrollment at Westmont High School is 446 students, with 82 seniors in the Class of 2017. The average per pupil operating cost in the 2014-2015 school year was \$18,354.29.</p>	<p><u>Faculty Members with Professional Educator Licenses</u></p> <p>Of the 46 licensed staff members at WHS, 39 hold Masters degrees. 22% of the faculty has 20 or more years of teaching experience.</p>
