Students live in sections of Westmont, Clarendon Hills, and Downers Grove.</p>	<p><u>Organization of School Year</u></p> <p>The school year consists of four quarters, each nine weeks long. The day is divided into seven 50-minute periods. The first semester ends on December 21, 2018, and the second semester ends on May 31, 2019.</p>
<p><u>School</u></p> <p>The Fall 2018 enrollment at Westmont High School is 389 students, with 103 students in the Class of 2019.
