<p><u>Community</u></p> <p>The school is 18 miles west of Chicago and serves a suburban residential area of approximately 25,000 people. Students live in sections of Westmont, Clarendon Hills, and Downers Grove.</p>	<p><u>School</u></p> <p>The Fall 2014 enrollment at Westmont High School is 434 students, with 100 seniors in the Class of 2015. The average composite ACT score in the Class of 2015 is 21.96. The average per pupil operating cost in the 2013-2014 school year was \$15,818.</p>
<p><u>Organization of School Year</u></p> <p>The school year consists of four quarters, each nine weeks long. The day is divided into seven 50-minute periods. The first semester ends on January 9, 2015, and the second semester ends on May 28, 2015.</p>	<p><u>Faculty Members with Professional Educator Licenses</u></p> <p>Of the 43 certified teachers at WHS, 32 hold Masters degrees. 28% of the faculty has 20 or more years of teaching experience.</p>
